Bookmobile Opt-Out





Limitless Libraries is the managing program of the collaborative partnership between Nashville Public Library (NPL) and Metro Nashville Public Schools (MNPS), dedicated to expanding access to resources for students, librarians, and educators through collection development, materials delivery, outreach, advocacy, and digital services. The addition of the Bookmobile enhances equitable access to public library materials for students across Davidson County, further extending the program's reach.

The NPL Bookmobile serves MNPS students in grades Pre-K through 12. In its first year, the Bookmobile will provide services exclusively to all MNPS charter schools. Service will then expand to include MNPS traditional and specialty schools, youth literacy organizations, and community organizations serving students.

All MNPS students are automatically opted in to access Bookmobile services using their student ID number, which serves as their Nashville Public Library card. Students not enrolled in MNPS must have a personal NPL library card to check out materials from the Bookmobile.
